Speaking on his Plan for Taking America Back

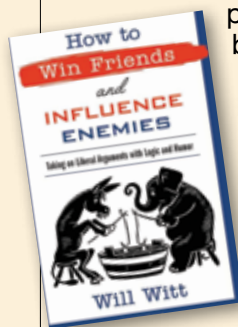


"How Conservatives Can Talk to the Other Side to Win"

ACTION ALERT ON AB-101 CRITICAL RACE THEORY

CRITICAL RACE THEORY.....AB-101 The bill recently passed and signed into Law that makes Critical Race Theory a requirement for high school graduation beginning with the 2029-2030 graduating class and requiring implementation of this curriculum in public and charter schools by 2025.

Background information:

The required program was developed by the Instructional Quality Commission (also called the Curriculum Development and Supplemental Commission) and was made up of 13 members appointed by Governor Newsom and the CA Legislature. This group worked on the guidelines for almost 4 years. The outcome was a set of guidelines and sample lesson plans covering 4 major areas: those in Black/African, Chicano, Native American and Asian American references. After much controversy, the Commission added Jewish Americans, Arab Americans, and Sikh Americans. This program became mandatory by the Governor signing AB-101.

The same commission is not considering applying the social justice paradigm to teaching K-12 math, that would "erase white supremacy" from the subject and

eliminate gifted classes for students. Proponents of this new math approach say the subject currently is taught with white supremacy...that it handicaps minority students by insisting on what they consider racist concepts, such as arriving at the correct answer.

What AB-101 Requires:

It requires the completion of a one-semester course in ethnic studies, as a requirement for graduation commencing with students graduating in the 2029-2030 school year (starting in the 2025-2026 school year) including for pupils enrolled in charter schools. The bill also authorizes local education agencies and charter schools to require a full year course in ethnic studies. A pupil may stratify the course requirement by completing either **(A)** a course on model curriculum in ethnic studies developed by the Commission, **(B)**

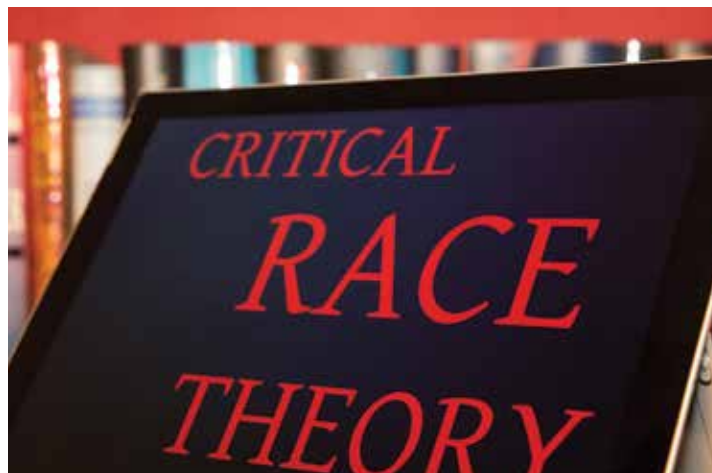
an existing ethnic studies course, **(C)** an ethnic studies course taught as part of a course that has been approved as meeting the A-G requirements of the University of CA and CA State University, or **(D)** a locally developed ethnic studies course approved by the governing board of the school district or the governing body of the charter school. The

bill prohibits a course that does not use ethnic studies content as the primary content through which the subject is taught from being used to satisfy the ethnic studies course requirement.

What you can do to shape the curriculum:

Parents and interested citizens need to get involved now. Since the class does not have to be implemented until 2025-2026, and AB-101 Requirement D, as noted above, allows the curriculum to be developed locally, a parent/citizen's committee to assist in the formation of the curriculum needs to be established in each CA School District.

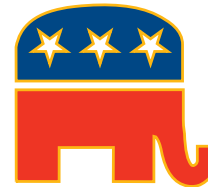
