'WHEN LIFE GETS YOU DOWN, RISE UP!'

We need some good news because Attorney General Merrick Garland is using the FBI to target parents who oppose Critical Race Theory. Follow Sen. Josh Hawley and Christopher Rufo about this matter.

Kacey McCallister was just 6 years old when he lost both of his legs from the tops of his thighs, when hit by a truck.

The doctors told his parents not to do things for him, but let him overcome his disability. "If my mom treated me like an invalid, I'd become an invalid," he said. "I had to do chores!" he joked. "I had to figure out how to vacuum the floor, do dishes, do laundry, make meals."

In his new book, 'When Life Gets You Down, Rise Up!' Kacey tells how he excelled in sports – he played wheelchair basketball, football, baseball, went to the

state championships for wrestling, and entered in a Spartan Race. He said, "I finally got to a point where I'm like, 'I'm an athlete, I'm a wrestler, I'm tough, and it really doesn't matter what other people think."

The Spartan obstacle race is an international franchise which often runs in the United States. Kacey didn't think he could finish the race, but "It didn't take myself long to realize that I was the one telling me that I couldn't do it. And so, I decided, 'You know what, I don't know if I can do it or not, I really don't. But I'm going to give it a try," he said.

He signed up for the race and, he completed it, although it took him 'forever.' "After finishing his first Spartan, Kacey went on to finish three increasingly difficult Spartan Races within 12 months of each other, earning the rare honor of becoming a Trifecta athlete in 2017." He has since entered 35 Spartan Races in many cities from Seattle to Hawaii.

Remember, this is a young man with no legs. Kacey is a graduate of Western Oregon University, and a motivational speaker. Kacey married Jennifer Sullivan, who is very supportive. They have five children, including a boy adopted from Ukraine. He lives in Oregon with his family.

Because of COVID, he is working with his father as a mechanic.

CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION UPDATE

CAMARILLO & CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION/ACTIVISM

New City Council Districts being reviewed by the Camarillo City Council. City leaders agreed to switch to district elections in 2019, instead of at-large-elections where voters from across the city got to choose who to vote for from among all the candidates. Even though there has been a council election since the change to district elections, the City Council does not meet diversity guidelines. New Districts will be used in the November 2022 Election and will stay in place until after the 2030 U.S. Census. One of the goals of redistricting is to help minority candidates be elected. The 2000 census showed that Camarillo's Hispanic or Latina voters have risen from 16% to 27%. Redistricting will create diversity and that there are representatives that represent each district. The deadline for the City Council to adopt the new district map is April 17, 2022. Camarillo City Council Hearings are set for November 10, 2021, January 26, 2021, and February 23, 2021. Members of the public are invited to get involved in the process by speaking at the hearings or create their own maps for the City Council to review. An internet based tool to help people draw maps is available on the City of Camarillo's website, and options for drawing maps on paper are also available. The following bills have been signed by Governor Newsom:

AB 37 MAIL-IN-BALLOTS/ ABSENTEE BALLOTS The Bill would extend the requirements to mail a ballot to every registered voter to all elections and apply them to all local election officials. The bill would require a vote by mail tracking system to be accessible to voters with disabilities. Additionally the bill would require county elections officials to permit any voter to cast a ballot using a certified remote accessible vote by mail system for any election. Further, the bill would provide that a vote by mail ballot is timely cast if it is voted on or before election day and, if returned by mail, received no later than 7 days after election day.

Status: Signed by Governor Newsom

SB 35 ELECTIONS

The Bill would expand prohibited activities around a polling place to include obstructing ingress, egress, and parking and specify that such activities are prohibited within 100 feet of (1) the entrance to a building that contains a polling place, an elections official's office, or satellite voting location, and (2) an outdoor site at which a voter may cast or drop off a ballot. The Bill would also prohibit a person from soliciting a vote, speaking to a voter about marking the voter's ballot, or disseminating visible or audible electioneering information in the immediate vicinity of a voter in line to cast a ballot or drop off a ballot. The Bill would extend the deadline for a candidate to submit tax returns to 88 days before the direct primary election. The Bill would require the Secretary of State to notify the candidate of deficiencies in redactions, and require the candidate to submit hard copies of returns with corrected redactions not later than 5:00 p.m. on the

78h day before the direct primary election. A candidate who does not submit timely corrected hardcopies would not be qualified to have their name placed on the ballot of the direct primary election.

Status: Signed by Governor Newsom

AB 453 SEXUAL BATTERY: NON-CONSENSUAL CONDOM REMOVAL

The Bill would make it explicitly illegal to remove a

condom during sex without consent. If signed, the State of California is the first to do so by expanding the civil definition of sexual battery and allowing the victims to sue for punitive damages.

Status: Signed by Governor Newsom


AB 1346 PHASE OUT OF THE SALE OF GAS-POWERED LEAF BLOWERS, LAWN MOWERS AND OTHER

SMALL OFF-ROAD ENGINES BY 2024

Under the new law, retailers will be limited to selling zero-emission equipment, such as electric or battery powered gear as part of an effort to cut down emissions. The new law also directs the California Air Resources Board to identify and make available, where feasible, funding for commercial rebates to go toward the purchase of electric equipment

Status: Signed by Governor Newsom
