## KEYNOTE SPEAKER JAMES E. "JIM" HORN

Conservative political activist, writer, and speaker, Jim Horn is a retired Diplomat and Counter-Terrorism expert who has been decorated for Valor and is a disabled veteran. He held the very highest levels of TOP SECRET Eyes Only security clearances.

As a Foreign Service Officer (diplomat), he was involved in Counter-Espionage working closely with various federal intelligence agencies; and after retirement with local Terror Early Warning Groups, the FBI's Joint Terror Task Force (JTTF), state and local law enforcement intelligence groups, and as a Counter-Terrorism/Security advisor to local law enforcement.

In 1975, Jim played a leading role in planning, organizing, and implementing the American evacuation from Phnom Penh, Cambodia. Not one person was left behind. Not one piece of paper was left for the Khmer Rouge to use to track down local Cambodians who were friendly to America.

As a top counter-Terrorism officer, he made American Embassies in South Asia, North Africa, and the Persian Gulf bomb-proof and safe from terrorist attacks.

His speaking topics include politics, terrorism, national

security, immigration and infiltration of America. He understands Islam and its hateful violence which he has witnessed and experienced. Jim knows the Islamist game plan to destroy our precious republic, who they are, and why they hate us so much.

Jim served abroad for 25-years, mostly in third-world countries, ten of those years in Islamic societies where he experienced Islam up close and personal and came to know and understand sharia compliant Islam better than most. He has studied Islam extensively and is considered to be one of the top 100 experts in America.

Jim has organized a successful program aimed at letting American youth educate themselves about Islam's colonizing efforts.

Jim spoke to the NFRW 2007 Biennial Convention, the first speaker to educate members about radical Islam.

*As the new season of autumn begins,* life also turns another page and provides us with new opportunities and challenges. Having attended state conventions this was a new blessing to expand my knowledge of the value and excitement of being a member of this larger national organization (experiencing the "mother ship" so to speak).

The NFRW now has 1,200 clubs and over 63,000 members. Ladies from all over the USA were there and it was a joy to engage with them and see all the various personalities and grasp their cohesiveness as a team. ## SB 10-TEN UNITS OR LESS

The CA Legislation Session ended on September 10, 2021. All bills will either be cleared to go to the Governor for signature, turned into two-year bills, or be dropped. Below is a list of some of the Bills that the CRWF Club has been tracking.

SB 9 and SB 10 Would end single-family zoning statewide CA SB9 and SB10 would end single-family zoning statewide by allowing multiple-lot-splits and multi-unit buildings on signal family streets, overriding local zoning. That would threaten the stability of our neighborhoods and home values. Both bills would be seriously destructive. SB 9 allows six housing units or more on signal family parcels statewide. SB 10 invites massive spot-zoning of apartment buildings on signal family streets.

**STATUS: THESE TWO BILLS HAVE PASSED IN THE SENATE AND THE ASSEMBLY PRIOR TO THE 9/14/2021 RECALL ELECTION AND WAS SIGNED BY GOVERNOR NEWSOM ON 9/16/2021.**

Sacramento: 9/16/2021 Governor Newsom signed bipartisan legislation to expand housing production in California, streamline housing permitting, and increase density to create more inclusive and vibrant neighborhoods across the state. The suite of bills, also will help address the interrelated problems of climate change and housing affordability by promoting denser housing

close to major employment hubs- a critical element in limiting California's greenhouse gas emissions. The Governor also highlighted the state's ongoing work to spur more housing production, tackle barriers to construction and hold local governments accountable.

"The housing affordability crisis is undermining the California Dream for families across the state, and threatens our long growth and prosperity", said Governor Newsom. "Making a meaningful impact on this crisis will take bold investments, strong collaboration across sectors and political courage from our leaders and communities to do the right thing and build housing for all."

**SB 503 Ballots and signature verification**  
Existing law requires an election official, upon receiving a vote by mail ballot, to verify the signature on the identification envelope by comparing it with the signature on specified records within the voter's registration record and outlines methods of verification. This bill would (1) apply a presumption, for purposes of comparison of signatures in the voter's registration record, that the signature on an identification envelope, signature verification statement, unsigned ballot statement or provisional ballot envelope, is the voter's signature; (2) specify that an exact signature is not required for an election official to determine that the signature is valid and the fact that signatures share similar characteristics is sufficient to determine the signature is valid; (3) permit an elections official to reject a ballot only if the official determines beyond a reasonable doubt that a voter's signatures does not compare to a signature in the voter's registration record. Additionally, this bill would delete verifying addresses on the vote by mail ballot return envelopes from the procedures that the observers may observe and challenge. Bottom-line... this bill reduces the requirements to verify signatures on ballots.

**STATUS: PASSED THE SENATE, PASSED THE ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE, READ SECOND TIME, AND ORDERED TO A THIRD READING.**

**AAB 110 Claims for unemployment compensation benefits for Inmates**  
This bill would require the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to provide the names and social security



numbers of current inmates' names, known aliases, birth date, booking date and expected release date, if known, of a current inmate to the Employment Development Department for the purposes of preventing payments on fraudulent claims for unemployment compensation benefits.

**STATUS: PASSED THE ASSEMBLY AND PASSED THE SENATE COMMITTEE, READ SECOND TIME, AND ORDERED TO THIRD READING.**

AB 994 The Personal Income Tax Law and the Corporation Tax Law

These two laws generally define "gross income" as income from whatever source derived except as specifically excluded. This bill, for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2021, and before January 1, 2026, would exclude under both laws, from the gross income the amount of a grant awarded pursuant to the California Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant Program. This would be a break for business

in California.

**STATUS: STILL IN COMMITTEE.**

AB 37 Mail-in-Ballots

This bill, similar to SB 29, extends the practice of sending mail in ballots to every registered voter for all elections, whether requested or not.

**STATUS: THIS BILL HAS PASSED IN THE SENATE AND THE ASSEMBLY AND HAS BEEN SENT ONTO GOVERNOR NEWSOM.**

NOTE: Due to the timing of some of these Bills already sent to the Governor for possible signature, the Status of the Bill may have changed before Members receive the October 2021 Trunkline. The CRWF Club will keep Members informed of the Status of the Bill(s).

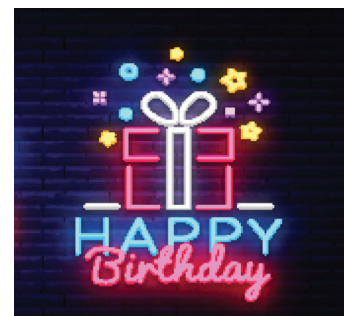

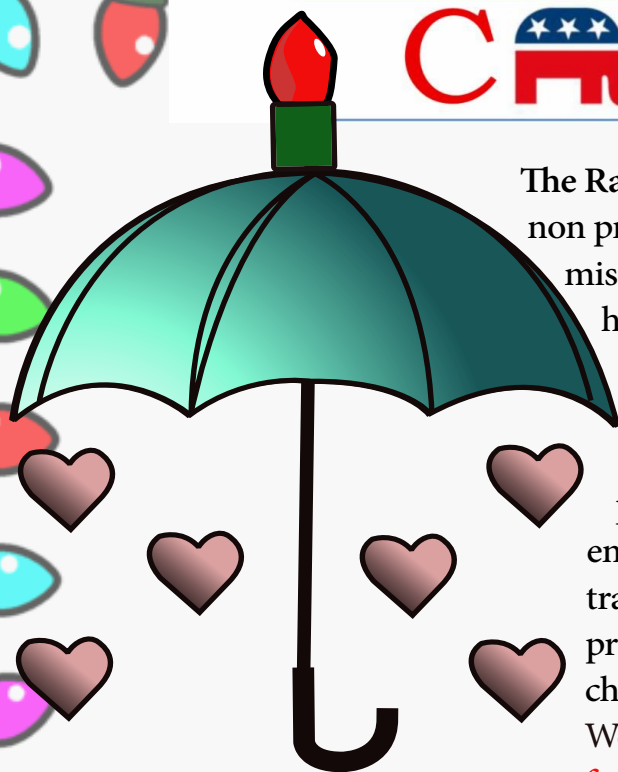

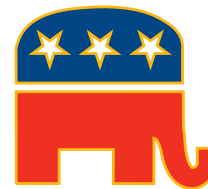
