# CA WATER INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING ACT (WIFA) 2022

#### CALL TO ACTION FOR ALL CFRW WOMEN: At

the California Federation of Republican Women (CFRW) Convention in October 2021, the CFRW joined with the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) and the Republican National Committee (RNC) in passing

several resolutions that focus on very important issues for both the State and National level. The key issues are:

- Water Infrastructure
- "Keep 9" effort to stop the packing of the Supreme
  Court
  - CRT in our Schools

Several months ago we published the CFRW Resolution on "Keep 9" effort to stop the packing of the Supreme Court. The second Resolution the CFRW is highlighting is Water Infrastructure:

At the Biennial CFRW Convention in October 2021, CFRW President Sue Blair signed, passed by vote of membership, a resolution in support of the Water Infrastructure Funding Act of 2022 (WIFA). WIFA is now a statewide ballot initiative for the November 2022 ballot. The WIFA is a coalition of people and organizations who believe it is up to the People to ensure California has reliable, abundant, and affordable water. WIFA in not a bond nor does it raise taxes, instead it dictates to the legislature to use existing paid tax dollars for water projects already identified. WIFA focus is on giving priority to underfunded projects already approved by the CA Water Commission administrated by 2014's Prop 1 Water Bond, to maximize CA's conveyance capacity along with the ability to move water around; upgrade and maintain dams; pay for desalination; underground storage, and water recycling.

The CA WIFA will amend our State's constitution with the support of a majority of CA voters. When water is abundant, everyone wins.

The Call to Action for CRWF Members and fellow Republicans is:

- 1. Get to know the Water Infrastructure Funding Act (WIFA) of 2022.
- 2. Then communicate to every CRWF
  Member and family and friends that we
  must do something to improve and secure our
  water future.
  - 3. Take a stand now! If we do not...our next opportunity will be in 2024.
  - 4. This is a nonpartisan issue, build a network and provide groups and/or organizations with bullet points to converse with.
  - 5. Contact all of your local, county, state and U.S. legislators and get them on board to bring awareness

to the water crisis.

The Federal Election Commission (FEC) website contains an online database

of campaign contributions by zip-code, city, individual or employer.

Did you know that 99% of political donations made by Twitter employees in 2021 were to help fund Democratic causes?

Did you know that out of the 823 donations,

561 were through the Democrat PAC ActBlue?

Did you know that only eight, or 1% of donations were to Republicans? Dan Gainer of the Media Research Center, according to the New York Post, was shocked that someone at Twitter actually gave to the GOP. "Gainer went on to say of the Twitter staffers, who have been accused of censoring

conservative commentary, their day-to-day actions also contribute to that political party."

Did you know that in 2021 94% of political contributions made by Google workers were to Democrats? \$652,000 to Democrats vs \$37,700 to Republicans.
