



## UNEMPLOYMENT GUARANTEED FOR NON-CITIZENS

#### PRIMARY ELECTIONS JUNE 7, 2022

#### Action Alert: "The Educational Freedom Act" Petition Deadline is early April 2022

Unemployment Guaranteed for Non-Citizens Primary Elections June 7, 2022....What You Need to Know

#### AB-2847 – Unemployment: Excluded Workers Pilot Program

Existing law prohibits payment of unemployment compensation benefits for services performed by a person who is not a citizen or national of the United States unless that person is an individual who was lawfully admitted for permanent residence at the time the services were performed, was lawfully present for purposes of performing the services, or was permanently residing in the United States under color of law at the time the services were performed, as specified.

#### This bill would establish, until January 1, 2025, the Excluded

Workers Pilot Program, to be administered by the Labor and Workforce Development Agency, for the purpose of providing income assistance to excluded workers (illegal aliens) who are not eligible for the state or federal benefits administered by the Employment Development Department and who are unemployed. The bill would make individuals eligible to receive \$300 per week for each week of unemployment occurring between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2023. The bill would appropriate \$690,000,000 from the General Fund to the agency for purposes of carrying out, implementing and administering the program. The bill would require the agency, on or before 8/1/24, to submit a report to the Governor and specific committees that makes recommendations for establishing permanent unemployment insurance benefit program for "workers" excluded from the unemployment insurance system based on their immigration status.

## Primary Election June 7, 2022 \* DO NOT Mail in Your Ballot \* Redistricting Confusion

\*County Officials will start mailing ballots to registered voters on May 9, 2022.

\*Do Not Vote By Mail. Mailed ballots are picked up by USPS; sorted by USPS; delivered to the County Mailroom; sorted again by Clerks; processed by Clerks; and ballot signatures are verified by temporary staff.....then finally your ballot is opened to be fed into a machine.

\* Go to a polling site to insert your ballot into the machine yourself.

\* Redistricting changed Camarillo into different Ventura County Board of Supervisors Districts. Part of Camarillo is now in District 2, which is currently Linda Parks' District. Linda Parks reached the end of her term. Two Republicans are running for District 2: Jeff Gorell and Tim McCarthy. A Republican win will change the balance of the County Board of Supervisors.

\*Redistricting also changed the Assembly District Camarillo is under, into 2 Assembly

Districts; District 38 (Steve Bennett, current State Assembly Member) and District 42 (Jacqui Irwin, current State Assembly Member). The following Republicans are running in the Primary Election: for District 38, Cole Brocato and for District 42, Lori Mills.

\*We have the opportunity to significantly increase the Republican stake hold in Congress. Current Democratic Congresswoman Julia Brownley must run to maintain her seat in the U.S. Congress 26th District. We have a strong Republican Candidate running who needs all of our support to win; Matt Jacobs. 

## THE CALIFORNIA HOUSING SPECULATION ACT

AB 1771, also known as the California Housing Speculation Act, proposes to add an additional 25% tax on the portion of capital gain from the sale or exchange of residential properties within three years of an investor's purchase of the property, with the tax declining in annual increments afterwards. The Act applies to investors in California residential properties, including fix and flip investors. If passed, the Act would become law on January 1, 2023. "There were at least 269,000 K-12 students in California experiencing homelessness at the end of the 2018-19 school year." (Los Angeles Times, October 1, 2020)

"The median family net worth of homeowners is more than \$230,000, according to the Fed, compared with \$5,000 for renters."

What was once mom and pop investors or local groups of business people who owned a few properties, now wealthy investors (whose families live in their own home or homes) are involved in purchasing single-family homes on a much greater scale for profit. This leads to sky-high rents and puts people on the streets in tents, or in cars or RVs.

We should not let foreigners and billionaires with cash, bid against our residents for single-family housing, and should stop flippers from doing the same. "Foreign US Home Sales Surge 49% to Record \$153 Billion," between April 2016 and March 2017. (F. McGuire, Newsmax Finance, 18 July 2017)

Investors bought \$49.9 billion worth of homes in the

"The Act is founded on the notion that soaring prices for homes in California are driven by investor-purchasers of residential properties in California. There is no carve out or exemption for fix and flip professionals, who perform valuable services by rehabilitating sub-standard housing stock."

"We want to get to 1 million homes in the next 15 years

or so", said Sean Dobson, CEO of Amherst, and he's adding 1,000 homes a month to his empire with the help of artificial intelligence.

Housing and food are basic necessities. Housing is a human right, and the main purpose of housing is for people to live in it.

Homeownership has been the basis to build wealth and transfer it to their children and grandchildren. A home with a backyard for their children to play and for family barbeques has made their lives pleasant. Owning a home can help pay for higher education. When it is paid off, a home can be a boon for retirement.



fourth quarter of 2021, up from \$35 billion a year earlier. As CoreLogic's recent analysis showed, investor purchases accounted for about a quarter (26%) of all home purchases in Q3 2021, up from 16% seen in 2019. Singlefamily homes made up about three-quarters (74.8%) of investor purchases in the fourth quarter.

Roofstock – "investors can buy stakes as low as 10% in singlefamily rental Houses, 'utilizing its

scalable, data-driven platform to build robust single-family rental portfolios and generate passive income." (Matt Harris, partner at Bain Capital Ventures)

Invitation Homes, Inc. - in 2019, its home occupancy rate ticked up to 96.5%, and rents in 2021 increased 11%. Blackstone made about \$7 billion when it sold its stake in Invitation Homes last year. Chief executive, Stephen Schwarzman took home a record \$1.1 billion in 2021. In 2021, American Homes 4 Rent's rental payment increase was 14%.

The average monthly rental payment for a new lease was up 14% in December 2021.
