RECAP OF 2022 ELECTION PROCESS

Presented by Nancy Wofford 3rd VP California FRW, Political Activities

At our December 13, General Meeting/Luncheon, Members and Guests had the opportunity to hear our Guest Speaker, Nancy Wofford, 3rd VP California FRW, Political Activities and Region 5 Director pro tem, reflect on the 2022 General Election in California. Below is Nancy's speech.

I am sure that many of you experienced the same reaction I did when you woke up on Wednesday morning after the November election. Where was that promised Red Wave? There is a danger in all the news stations telling us that we are definitely going to win big. It gives people a false sense of confidence that their vote won't matter if they do not get their ballot returned on time. Perhaps one or two votes can be tossed, but it turns into hundreds or possibly thousands of lost votes. When that happens, we feel duped once again.

And, doesn't it seem strange that when things do go wrong it always seems to be in a swing state or elections where the Republican is ahead on election night?

Election Integrity...Reports were coming in from Arizona that their machines were not working properly keeping voters in line for a very long time and many ended up leaving not getting to vote at all.

Or this news flash, "BREAKING - TEXAS: Multiple locations in Harris County (population 4.7 million) have been experiencing "serious computer problems" this morning and are not able to count votes. Only 10 of the 50 machines are currently working! Really?

"In Detroit, People are showing up to Vote only to be told, "sorry, you have already voted." This is happening in large numbers, elsewhere as well. Doesn't this ring of what happened in 2020 in CA?

Pennsylvania announced that it could take days to determine the winner. And, instead of I Voted Stickers they should have read, I thought I had voted.

Even locally, a friend of mine working a poll reported a power-out situation. Of course, CA is not a swing state but this was definitely in a more conservative area.

So, this tells me that the Democrats have figured out that Republicans want to go to the polls in person and vote on the last day. What it should tell Republicans is that it is dangerous to wait until the last day. Insanity is doing the same thing over and over and expecting different results.

In CA our polls open 3 days before the last day, so if a person wants to vote in-person they can go on any of those days. The ballots are the same as the ones they received in the mail so they can also drop the mail in ballots off at the polls anywhere in their county.

Every Sunday I work at the Reagan Library and the library has one of the few open election polls in our area. While I was taking a break, I visited the polls just to see how things were going and I saw something that gave me real hope that we are finally getting it. Sitting quietly across from the check-in desk was a poll observer. She was just watching the elections. No one seemed upset or having a woke moment.

"The 2020 elections produced a record number of charges of corruption of the voting process." We were all reminded over and over about these charges. One result of all that publicity happened quickly in Virginia, there was a dramatic increase in the number of people who volunteered to serve as poll observers and poll workers in Virginia's statewide election in 2021. And guess what? There were virtually no **reports** of election fraud in Virginia that year.

LEGISLATION AND ACTIVISM



Unfortunately, there are always people, some of them well-organized, who will vote illegally or cheat IF THEY THINK THEY CAN GET AWAY WITH IT. Election integrity depends on the willingness of thousands of public-spirited citizens to serve as volunteers inside that process.

Our elections are in jeopardy.....if we do not take them seriously.

People do not hold the midterm election as important as the general election, and therefore they make the bad choice not to vote at all. I know here in CA we have a very low opinion of just how much our vote really counts, but it does count in many races.

Mid-term elections are vital in saving our state and country. Remember the summer of chaos? When Antifa and BLM were burning things down? Governors and mayors had a lot of pull in the decisions that were made. Elections do have consequences!

We have seen with our eyes the destruction and lack of safety in voting. Slowly over time, the left has stealthily changed the laws dealing with our election system.

It started years ago in baby steps; Absentee ballots, no ID to vote, Provisional voting, early and extended voting, street indexes, ballot harvesting, last minute voter registration and more.

And now millions of ballots float through the USPS. If you can confidently put \$500 of your cash into an envelope and drop it in a mailbox mailing it back to yourself without worry, then voting by mail might be your thing.

Democrats swear there is no fraud in our voting, nothing illegal, but indeed fraud itself has become legal. Every one of these actions mentioned, and many more, have led to our diminished vote.

CA has become the model for the rest of the country because we have failed to act decisively with a united authority. Our CA flawed elections are the road map for the theft of elections across the states. Yes, CA, we have been the Guinea pig.

There is always someone who has lived here in CA who moves to another state where they immediately hear statements like, "Californians! Stay home! (Texas, or Idaho or Tennessee (insert state) is full! Don't bring CA here!"

If the people in those "other states" do not want what is happening in CA to happen in their states, they should get busy and help CA candidates. Nothing says they cannot donate to our Republican candidates to help us get rid of Gavin Newsom and his ilk.

The borders between states are open; and people who have lived in CA, need to realize the urgency of saving CA. Moving, no matter where, no matter how conservative the area, will not save the disease of the left from finding you. You may be last to lose your freedom, but you will be included.

If we start earlier than 5 months ahead of an election, we can do better next time. Poll watching and drop box monitoring must continue in CA and must expand to every polling site, to help save our elections.

Every parent needs to be an active participant in their children's schools educational operations and curriculum. Hopefully, here in California we will have a repeat of the CA School Choice initiative

out early next year so we can jump on that and try to influence the education of our children, before they are completely indoctrinated. "Give me four years to teach the children and the seed I have sown will never be **uprooted.**" Vladimir Lenin.

Not only must we end this crazy stuff going on in our public schools like Critical Race Theory and Drag Queen Drama, California needs to qualify and pass The Educational Freedom Act. Things are getting worse. The National Education Association floated a proposal to change language in its contracts. Words like mother, father and maternity leave would have gender neutral terms such as, 'Birthing parent; non-birthing parent and parental leave." The proposal was dropped, but like Pelosi it will resurface.

Michael Alexander, CEO of the Education Freedom Act writes, "the classroom is the real battlefield. This is where the real struggle for the hearts, minds and souls of our children is being waged. This is where the real future of America will be decided. This is why we must waste no time in asserting the natural right of all parents to control and direct the moral, intellectual, and religious formation of their own children."

A bright spot is that many of the School Board offices went Red in some of our northern states including NY. A child born today will never know, or understand, the joy of living in a proud and free America unless WE stand up TODAY.

There was good news coming out of 2022. Stacy Abrams conceded to Kemp in GA, DeSantis basically turned all of Florida Republican even turning Miami/ Dade an ultra-Democratic blue, to red. Things were so scary for the Democrats in Florida that their liberal newspaper The Sun Sentinel called Florida a Crimson Hellscape.

Greg Abbott won Texas sending Beto O'Rourke one more time to the curb. The 3rd time was not a charm for O'Rourke. Kevin McCarthy, Tom McClintock, Shannon Grove, Doug LaMalfa, David Valadao, Young Kim, Michelle Steel, Mike Garcia and other

Republicans won in this CA, changing the house to red.

There are some things to celebrate even if we were hoping for more. Even CNN was shocked by the speech Biden gave after the election saying he would not change anything in the next two years while 72% of the country say we are heading in the wrong direction. That alone raises a lot of questions.

We need to keep our fight; no one knows what the next election will bring but if we start earlier with better strategy and with more volunteer hearts to keep an eye out, we can do this.

As our 40th President said,

"It's hard, when you're up to your armpits in alligators, to remember you came here to drain the swamp."

One final thing. Last Month, I stood on a hill in my Reagan Library uniform and watched one of the Auschwitz train cars being moved into the courtyard at the Reagan Library in preparation for their next exhibit opening in the spring, The History of Auschwitz. Not **Long Ago. Not far away.** What an emotional hour in that experience. It makes me think how lucky we are that we have not experienced anything close to what those mothers, fathers and children had to endure, it reminded me why I continue to fight when sometimes it is easier to just say no.

So, election 2022 is over! Take a minute to breathe to enjoy the Christmas and Holiday Season and then dig in for the 2024 election because we will need every bit of our creative energies to beat the left at their own game. So as long as I am able, I will fight for CA.
