BEWARE OF PROPOSITION 1 AND ITS BILLION-DOLLAR PRICE

Voter Alert! Proposition 1 entitled Behavioral Health Services Program and Bond Measure will be on the March 5, 2024, ballot. Per the California Federation of Republican Women's October 17, 2023, Capitol Update:

Proposition 1 includes two key provisions: (1) a \$6.4 billion bond to pay for Governor Gavin Newsom's desired overhaul of the mental health system and adding substance abuse to the list of mental health disorders. Democrats will be asking for a Yes vote and Republicans will be asking for a No vote.

Newsom said in a written statement that "the mental health crisis affects us all, and people who need the most help have been too often overlooked. We are working to ensure no one falls through the cracks, and that people get the help they need and the respect they deserve." While the desire to do good is admirable, why do the taxpayers bear the cost burden when other expenses such as services to illegal immigrants could be cut?

BACKGROUND

Per Ballotpedia:

Proposition 1 is the product of Senate Bill 326 and Assembly Bill 531 passed during the 2023 legislative session. Both contained provisions requiring the bills to appear jointly on the March 5, 2024, ballot as Proposition 1. Senate Bill 326 passed the Senate on May 24, 2023, by a vote of 39-0 with one absent. An amended version of SB 326 passed the state Assembly on September 12, 2023, by a vote of 68-7. The Senate concurred with the amendments by a vote of 40-0 on September 14, 2023. The bond measure was introduced as Assembly Bill 531 on February 8, 2023. It passed the Assembly on May 30, 2023, by a vote of 80-0. An amended version was passed in the state Senate on September 14, 2023, by a vote of 35-2. The Assembly concurred with the amendments on the same day and passed the amended version by a vote of 66-8.

A "yes" vote supports:

- renaming the Mental Health Services Act (2004) to the Behavioral Health Services Act and expanding its purpose to include substance use disorders;
- changing how revenue from the 1% tax on income above \$1 million is spent under the law, including requiring 30% of the Behavioral Health Services Fund be allocated to housing intervention programs;

- increasing the size of the oversight commission from 16 to 27 voting members; and
- issuing \$6.380 billion in bonds to fund housing for homeless individuals and veterans with mental health or substance use disorders.

A "no" vote opposes changing the Mental Health Services Act and issuing \$6.4 billion in bonds for homeless individuals and veterans.

AUTHOR'S EDITORIAL NOTE:

The Democrat Governor with his Democrat-controlled State legislature, liberal judiciary, and local political allies have created the homeless crisis in the first place by implementing policies that only increased the homeless situation within their communities. But rather than addressing the policies that are making homelessness worse, the Democrats want ALL Californians to pay for this new program, for generations, with ZERO guarantee that this will ever actually solve the problem for which it has been created.

Democrat policies are already forcing housing projects into the suburbs effectively destroying the peace and tranquility of these communities and some would argue it also guarantees the turning of a Republican community to Democrat.

While the homeless "crisis" definitely tugs at the heartstrings, Proposition 1 seems to be just another progressive program designed to REDISTRIBUTE WEALTH, destroy the suburbs, and enrich political cronies. NOT SO FAST: Distinguished Scientist Shunned for Saying Climate Crisis Overblown

What is the probability of dying from an external event, rather than from an ailment such as cancer or heart disease? As an exercise, list the following external potential life-ending events in order of the probability that you think might kill you: automobile crash, airplane crash, pandemic more deadly than COVID, weather-related event from a storm (drowning or collapse of structure) unrelated to "climate change." Weather-related events caused by global warming: earthquake, volcanic event (either directly from the eruption or from crop failure due to diminished sunlight), asteroid impact, nuclear war, conventional war, famine caused by the collapse of the monetary system, famine caused by farm animal and plant diseases and others.

Some of the external events that could kill you can be mitigated by more investment to prevent or better cope with them. Human beings, however, can do little about volcanic eruptions or variations in the output of the sun. To make rational decisions about how much to spend to address each risk, it must first be determined the probability of the risk and then how much it will cost per life to be saved.

The current rage is all about climate change. To be sensible, it is important that the rate of change be determined and then make judgments about the ability of humans to alter that rate in a significant way, at a reasonable cost per person. Judith A. Curry is a distinguished climate scientist and former chair of the School of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences at the Georgia Institute of Technology. She had become increasingly concerned about the politicization and hype of climate science. Some politicians and their press lackeys have held forth with a never-ending stream of doomsday climate scenarios over the last three decades. Former Vice President Al Gore told us that the Arctic ice sheet would be gone by now, as would Miami Beach, but both are still with us. Ms. Curry had observed that most of the "climate models" had consistently run too "hot" in that they projected much faster increases in temperature that was actually occurring (other leading climate scientists, including the late Fred Singer, Dennis Avery and Pat Michaels, had made the same observations). If the world is actually getting warmer at a much slower rate than alarmists have been saying, it means we have more time to make adjustments to human impact on the climate. Ms. Curry has argued that even if we immediately stopped all emissions from greenhouse gases, it would take decades for that to have any impact — and we have plenty of time to make an orderly transition from fossil fuels to more promising nuclear and

geothermal energy sources (wind and solar have very limited potential and are turning out to be much more costly to both build and maintain than many proponents claimed).

Some of Ms. Curry's fellow academics did not like her argument that the climate crisis was overblown. She went from being lauded for her work to increasingly being an outcast. Academics and others in any field have a vested interest in overstating the importance of their area of expertise because funding goes to those who can argue that they are dealing with the greatest threat. There is a limited pool of money, so the people who build rockets that can alter the trajectory of potential killer asteroids are to some extent fighting over the same pool of money that can be used for better airline safety, or pandemic mitigation, or combating climate change).

In 2016, Ms. Curry resigned her university position, in part to get away from the academic BS (my words, not hers) and joined the private sector as president of the Climate Forecast Applications Network to work on real, applied science, without having to be politically correct. She has just published a book, "Climate Uncertainty and Risk: Rethinking Our Response." It is a brilliant tome, filled with many important insights and several thousand footnotes to document her arguments.

Throughout the book, Ms. Curry is careful to explain the difference between what we think we know for certain, what we know that we don't know, and what we don't know that we don't know. Ms. Curry argues that we know the planet has been warming since at least 1860, and that the rise in carbon dioxide from the burning of fossil fuels is responsible for at least some of that warming. She argues that what we do not know is how much of the rise in carbon dioxide is caused by human fossil fuel burning, rather from natural variability. She also argues that we do not know if the warming is dangerous, or how much warming we can expect over the next century, let alone how much benefit, if any, we can expect from reducing carbon dioxide emissions. The irony is that to date, global warming has saved lives — more people die from cold than heat — and plants (food) grow faster when the air contains higher levels of carbon dioxide.

Ms. Curry is first rate when explaining alternative risks and why caution is wise in trying to mitigate them. "Climate Uncertainty" is a serious, nonpolitical book, which will help to elevate the level of scientific and political discourse. It should be read by everyone who writes or speaks about climate change, including the political and media class.

Moral Equivalence Means Either Moral Confusion or Hatred of Israel

Moral equivalence has two purposes. One is to enable the morally confused to hide their confusion. The other is to enable the immoral to hide their immorality.

Here are two examples as applied to the Israeli-Arab conflict:

One is the assertion we hear regarding the latest Israel-Hamas war by members of the Western Left, by Muslim supporters of the Palestinians and even by a few individuals on the right: "Palestinian babies are as precious as Israeli babies."

Professor Cornel West, a lifelong progressive running for president as a Democrat: "As I have said for the past 50 years, a precious Palestinian child has the same value as a precious Israeli child."

David Cronin, an editor at Electronic Intifada, a large pro-Palestinian, anti-Israel website: "Palestinian babies are just as precious as my new daughter."

A second example is to avoid condemning Hamas for the wars they start by instead condemning the "cycle of violence."

Let's analyze the two statements.

That the lives of Palestinian children are as precious as those of Israeli children is a given. But it is meaningless given that virtually no Israeli or Israel-supporter has ever claimed otherwise. Indeed, it is usually worse than meaningless. It is usually a nice-sounding way to attack Israel and its supporters.

Would those who make this assertion have made it

during World War II? After all, it is certainly true that Japanese and German children are as precious as American children. But what purpose would such an assertion have served? Would it have meant that Americans should drop no bombs on Japan or Germany? Presumably not. And if it would have, the statement would have been nothing more than a pro-German or pro-Japanese sentiment. Or would it have meant that America should avoid gratuitously killing Japanese and German civilians? If so, it would have served little purpose, since even if American pilots bombed only military and industrial targets inside Japan and Germany, many Japanese and German civilians, including children, would still have been killed. And, to cite the best-known example, the killing of Japanese civilians in Hiroshima and Nagasaki ended the war in the Pacific, thereby saving an exponentially greater number of Japanese and American lives.

The reason America, Britain, and Canada dropped bombs on Germany, and the reason America dropped bombs on Japan, was solely because Germany and Japan started World War II and because they committed horrific evils. Defeating those two countries was as clear a moral imperative as there could ever be. The Germans unleashed the unique slaughter known as the Holocaust and committed a massive number of atrocities against civilians in every country they conquered. The Japanese committed mass murder and Nazi-like atrocities on Chinese, Korean and Filipino civilians (such as grotesque medical experiments on non-anesthetized Chinese and the use of conquered women to be gang-raped on a daily basis by Japanese soldiers).

Therefore, why would someone have noted during World War II that Japanese and German babies are as precious as American or British babies? If it were to encourage the Allies to avoid gratuitous civilian deaths, and the maker of the statement were clear about the necessity and morality of bombing those terrible countries, no one would have disputed the statement. But if it were to draw some moral equivalence between the Allies and Japan and Germany, between their bombings and the Allied bombings, the person would be abettor of evil.

The same holds true for all those who now assert that Israeli and Palestinian children are equally precious. Given that the Palestinian regime in Gaza, i.e., Hamas, is dedicated to murdering every Jew in Israel -- great-grandmothers down to infants; given that Hamas and all their Muslim and non-Muslim left-wing supporters around the world seek to annihilate the nation of Israel; given that Israel has, almost uniquely among the nations of the world, regularly warned Gaza civilians to evacuate buildings that Israel planned to bomb (thereby losing the advantage of a surprise attack on Hamas operatives); and given that Hamas places its leaders and weapons in schools, hospitals and apartment buildings for the express purpose of bringing death down on women and children, what exactly do those who assert that Israeli and Palestinian babies are equally precious seek to accomplish?

Unless accompanied by a completely unambiguous condemnation of the Hamas attacks on Israel via thousands of rockets and directly on Jewish parents and children, including babies, as war crimes and utter evil; and unless accompanied by a clear moral distinction between Israel and Hamas, the only reason for announcing that Israeli and Palestinian babies are equally precious is to engage in anti-Israel moral relativism.

Indeed, the only context in which this assertion would be useful is if it were directed at Hamas and its Muslim and left-wing supporters. It is they who do not believe that Israeli and Palestinian children are equally precious. As Al-Monitor, a non-partisan Mideast news website founded by an Arab-American, reported:

"The Israeli medical staff of Tel Hashomer Hospital is fighting for the life of a 6-month-old Palestinian infant abandoned by her parents. ... Cancer-stricken children from the West Bank and Gaza have always been treated there alongside children from Israel."

As regards the "cycle of violence," it is hard to imagine a more anodyne description of the Israel-Hamas war. Again, did anyone ever use this as a description of

World War II? Why not? There certainly was a cycle of violence. But no one ever used the term, because it would have been an immoral description of what was happening. The "cycle of violence" was not the problem; Japanese and German violence was the problem.

And that is the case now. The moral problem is not the cycle of violence; it is Palestinian violence.

Without violence from Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank, there would be no "cycle of violence."
